Miles Morrow, born in Ft. Lauderdale, FL, comes from a musical family and started playing electric guitar at age 7. Once he started, he was hooked, and has been taking weekly lessons ever since. As young as age 8 Miles participated in a rock band program, performing at local venues and restaurants all around Nashville about four times a year. His first full band experience was a family affair as he played with his brother, a drummer, in a band called Sugar Rush who performed at showcases and kid-friendly venues around Nashville.

He has always enjoyed performing and played in his first school talent show when he was just 9 years old and has continued every year since. Recently Miles has taken up jazz guitar, piano and saxophone, and he also plays 1<sup>st</sup> chair stand-up bass in his school orchestra at Woodland Middle School.

Miles has attended many music camps, including Recording Studio and Music Production camp, Guitar Shredding camp, Songwriting camp, and was selected to play lead guitar in the All-Star band in the prestigious "Kids on Stage" Summer program in Leiper's Fork, TN. In the fall of 2019, Miles was selected as one of only five Nashville-based musicians to participate in The Acoustic Guitar Project, a global music platform and concert series that inspires musicians to write an

original song and record it live in one week. And Miles is honored to be mentored by one of Nashville's premier guitarists, Adam Shoenfeld, a multiple nominee for the Academy of Country Music's Guitarist of the Year award and a current member of Tim McGraw's touring band.

Today and for the past 3 years, Miles plays lead guitar with the Next Door Boys ([www.nextdoorboysrock.com](http://www.nextdoorboysrock.com)). Formed in January 2017, the group recently won the 2019 City of Brentwood school-age Battle of the Bands and has a standing monthly gig at the world-famous Lower Broadway Entertainment District in downtown Nashville. Since they formed, they have performed at various venues in Spring Hill, Columbia, Franklin, Brentwood, Nolensville and Nashville. Miles also plays guitar in his church's youth band that performs about once a month during Sunday morning services.



When Miles is not playing music, he enjoys typical 13-year-old activities such as hanging with his two older brothers, traveling with his family, reading and playing video games. He's also focused on his schoolwork and has won many academic and character awards. But music is his first love and passion, and he plans to continue his development for years to come!
